REQUESTS FOR RESPONSES FROM MEMBERSHIP...

Sally Schwab, President-Elect of ACPE and Chairperson of an ACPE Task Force for "Self-Study of Organizational Structure" will attend our regional meeting at the Canterbury Center. Sally will make a presentation following breakfast on Friday morning about this issue, and she will seek responses/feedback from the members of the Southeast Region. The concern that created the Task Force was the expense of representation in ACPE governance. Reduce representation and reduce expenses; but then, how can there be representation? Reduced numbers of representatives reduces representation; but should the regions bear the costs of being represented in the governance of the ACPE? Or, should a Bd of Reps and all commissions be the functioning bodies of the ACPE (not necessarily regionally represented), and the costs of those functioning bodies be assumed by the ACPE?

A BIT OF HISTORY...

On 16 July '09 the 21st Annual Summer Banquet of the **Chattanooga Association for Clinical Pastoral Care** was held at the First Centenary United Methodist Church in Chattanooga. Phil Summerlin (first ACPE Supervisor on staff, now retired), Keith Munford (ACPE Supervisor), and Olen Grubbs (ACPE Supervisor and present Director of CPE) were in attendance.

On October 22, 1984 Jap Keith addressed a gathering of physicians and clergyman at an "information dinner" on the topic of "What is Clinical Pastoral Education?" Roger Meyer, Ph.D. psychologist, served as President of the CACPC. Rev. Ferd White, Chaplain at Erlanger, secured the support of the religious and the medical communities for this CPE program. Phil was employed in the fall of '85, and the first unit of CPE was completed in May, 1986. The center was accredited in '86. Keith came in '95 and Olen in '97. The banquet on this night was a joyous celebration of past accomplishments and an enthusiastic embracing of future hopes.
